



Campus Hazing Transparency Report

Updated as of July 30, 2026

In accordance with the [Stop Campus Hazing Act](#), the Campus Hazing Transparency Report lists all student organizations that have been determined through the college's student conduct process to have violated the hazing policy. This report is intended to promote transparency, accountability, and student safety and will be updated twice a year.

The Campus Hazing Transparency Report includes the following information for each hazing incident:

- The name of the student organization
- A general description of the violation that resulted in a finding of responsibility,
- Including:
 - Whether the violation involved the abuse or illegal use of alcohol or drugs.
 - The findings of the institution.
 - Any sanctions placed on the student organization by the college, as applicable.
- The dates on which:
 - The incident was alleged to have occurred.
 - The investigation into the incident was initiated.
 - The investigation ended with a finding that a hazing violation occurred.
 - The institution provided notice to the student organization that the incident resulted in a hazing violation.

The report will not include personally identifiable information.

Reports of hazing that did not result in a finding of responsibility are excluded from this report. All information for this report will be maintained for a period of five calendar years from the date of publication.

Annual statistics on hazing are available on the college's Annual Security and Fire Safety Report. Hazing statistics include incident reports that meet the federal definition of hazing in the Higher Education Act of 1965. Such statistics do not reflect actual findings of hazing behavior, which are included in the Campus Hazing Transparency Report.

July 1, 2025 – December 15, 2025

There were no findings of responsibility for hazing violations between 07/01/2025 and 12/15/2025.

December 15, 2025 - July 30, 2026

There were no findings of responsibility for hazing violations between 12/15/2025 and 7/30/2026.

Hazing Policy

SKC prohibits hazing as outlined and defined in [2025-26 Catalog: Student Code of Conduct and Misconduct Procedures](#), and in addition to the actual act of hazing the following actions are prohibited:

1. Involvement in the planning of and/or being present during the commissioning of hazing.
2. Implying that a person will be shunned, removed, or unable to join, participate, or maintain affiliation or membership in any organization, athletic team, or living group for failing or refusing to partake in or submit to any form of hazing activity.
3. Failure to intervene, prevent, or stop hazing if the individual has prior knowledge of a planned hazing activity.
4. Knowingly making a false accusation of hazing.
5. Failure to report information about suspected violations of this policy if required to do so as described in Section (F) of this policy.
6. Failure to cooperate in an investigation or Student Conduct Resolution Process, as outlined in the Abuse of the Student Code of Conduct System section of the Student Code of Conduct.

Although Montana does not have any statewide anti-hazing laws, hazing activities may still be prosecutable under other existing laws, such as those covering assault, battery, or endangerment.

Prevention and Education

SKC has a strong, coordinated program of targeted educational events, materials and programs addressing violence prevention, awareness, bystander intervention and risk reduction.

Bringing in the Bystander is an evidence-based campus bystander intervention program. This curriculum uses a community responsibility approach. It teaches the campus community how to

safely intervene in instances where sexual violence, relationship violence, or stalking may be occurring or where there may be risk that it will occur.

Sexual Assault Prevention for Undergraduates (Vector)- Required for all first-year incoming students.

Report Hazing

To report a hazing incident:

Students, employees, and other members of the campus community are encouraged to promptly report suspected hazing to SKC Campus Security or another appropriate College official.
